CTRW Scholarship Endowment Foundation/ Chairman Zenia Warren

Central Texas Republican Women established a Scholarship Program in December 1999, to honor the future women of Bell County. A Non-Profit organization known as the CTRW Scholarship Endowment, the foundation was established to manage and support this scholarship. The first scholarship was awarded in August 2002.

Kitty Pope, a dedicated member of our organization, was the driving force behind the creation of this scholarship. Her vision and effort were instrumental in its establishment. In honor of her memory, the scholarship was named after her. Kitty, a long-time Temple resident, and her husband, Hermon "Sonny" Pope, were passionate Republican volunteers.



The then \$500.00 scholarship has been awarded each year to a Bell County woman that has, or is completing high school within the county. The amount has increased over the years, and a \$1000.00 scholarship will be awarded to a female recipient this year. A second Scholarship was later established in the name of Sonny Pope, Kitty's husband and may be awarded to a male or female recipient. Process for applicants includes TWO Letters of Reference, copy of the official transcript, a copy of all areas of service to school and their community, and the hardest, a printed opinion/essay answering the question "What does it Mean to Be an American?"

This year's applicants are all qualified for scholarships. Unfortunately, we can only award two scholarships. We have a very special program scheduled for our upcoming April 15th luncheon. Please join us in Congratulating our Scholarship Endowment Winners.

Happy spring, everyone. It was wonderful seeing y"all and catching up on news at our March meeting. As I mentioned, this year, The Texas Federation of Republican Women will focus on domestic violence awareness as a caring for America endeavor. So, our focus on caring for America will parallel theirs. We will partner with The Children's Advocacy Center of Central Texas (CAC) this year. Their mission is to "provide and promote hope, healing, and justice for abused children" in hopes of restoring lives and ending the cycle of neglect and abuse. Their vision is that "every child grows and develops in a healthy environment free of abuse". Their core values are: "wellness for children, justice integrity, collaboration, empathy". Per their website, more than 2,200 children were victims of child abuse in Bell, Coryell, and Milam Counties. Children are our hope for the future, so I cannot think of a more worthwhile project. We aim to provide support by donating needed snacks and care closet items and active membership involvement with their upcoming fair. At our March meeting, Debra Longley, the executive director of CAC, spoke about their mission and needs.



The CAC is hosting a Child Abuse Prevention Fair on April 20, 2024, from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at Carl Levin Park in Harker Heights. They need 5-7 volunteers to help as follows:

- Set up before the event (arrive at 9:00 a.m.)
- Clean up
- Greeting guests
- Storybook reading: The CAC selected a classic fairytale. They would love for 2-3 volunteers to
 dress up and make the story come alive for the children and their families. They provide the
 book and the decorations. We provide the people and the extras to make the story exciting for
 the children. Stories are read every half hour during the event, starting at 10:15 a.m.

Other needs of the CAC are Snacks such as peanut butter and crackers, animal crackers with or without frosting, and any flavor of goldfish; Care Closet Items such as stuffed animals, blankets, fidget toys, journals, coloring books, books for teens, and books for younger children.

You can bring any items to our April meeting on April 15th or the the fair on April 20th. Thank you all in advance for the outstanding support I know you will provide for this worthwhile project. I know we will continue to make a difference in our community as we join forces with the CAC to bring awareness to child abuse and contribute to the healing process of abused children through our donations and support while also KEEPING TEXAS RED!



March has been a busy month, and so has protecting our border! In 2023, Texas lawmakers approved Senate Bill 4. This bill allows Texas police to arrest people for illegally crossing the Mexico border. Federal courts temporarily blocked the law from going into effect. However, the U.S. Supreme Court, in a 6-3 decision on Tuesday, March 19, voted that those illegally crossing the Texas-Mexico border can take effect. However, later that evening, the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals panel temporarily put it on hold (again). We continue to monitor the enforcement to protect our borders.

- Building our OWN Texas border wall
- ✓ Transporting over 104,000 MIGRANTS to sanctuary cities
- ✓ Installing MORE razor wire and anti-climb border barriers
- Expanding border security operations to keep Americans SAFE
- Deploying THOUSANDS of Texas National Guard soldiers and DPS troopers

Let's remember to pray for protection for our Texas law enforcement and Texas National Guard.
