




CTRW Scholarship Endowment Foundation/ Chairman Zenia Warren

Central Texas Republican Women established a Scholarship Program in December,1999,

to honor the future women of Bell County. A Non-Profit organization known as the CTRW Scholarship Endowment Foundation was established to manage and to support this scholarship. The first scholarship was awarded in



named the scholarship in memory of Kathryn "Kitty" Pope, whose vision and effort were a catalyst for its establishment. Kitty was a long-time Temple resident. She and her husband, Hermon "Sonny" Pope, were enthusiastic and dedicated Republican volunteers.

The then \$500.00 scholarship has been awarded each year to a Bell County woman that has, or is completing high school within the county. The Amount has increased over the years and a \$1000.00 scholarship will be awarded this year to a female recipient. A second Scholarship was later established in the name of Sonny Pope, Kitty's husband and may be awarded to a male or female recipient. Process for applicants includes TWO Letters of Reference, copy of the official transcript, a copy of all areas of service to school and their community, and the hardest, a printed opinion/essay answering the question "What does it Mean to Be an American?"

This year's applicants are all qualified for scholarships. Unfortunately, we can only award two scholarships. We have a very special program scheduled for our upcoming April 17th luncheon. Please join us in Congratulating our winners.

He is risen, He is risen, and He lives forevermore!



Volunteering involves greeting, answering phones, answering questions, and learning new skills. And volunteering is lots of fun as you support your local Republican Party.

Legislative Chair/Joyce Damon

The Texas Legislature has been busy this past month filing bills and holding hearings. They are considering nine bills aimed at strengthening the state's electricity grid. Among those is SB 6, which would direct the state to hire one company (or more) to build up to 10,000 megawatts of new gas-fueled power generation that can be activated during emergencies. SB 7 would allow power generators to bid a day ahead on providing a specific service separate from the everyday energy market. SB 2012 would provide parameters for a proposal to the Public Utility Commission to incentivize companies to build more dispatchable power or keep existing dispatchable power online. SB 1287 would require the PUC to cap how much Texans would pay for power producers to connect to the state's power grid and require the companies to pick up the remaining cost.

Also submitted were:

- -SB 15 would require participation in intercollegiate sports competitions based on the student's biological sex.
- -SB 12 would prohibit sexually explicit performances like drag shows from being performed in the presence of a child.
- -SB 1927 would allow the Texas Supreme Court to appoint a state prosecuting attorney. It would give the prosecuting attorney jurisdiction to prosecute election crimes, abortion crimes, bribery and corruption, and other crimes that might be politicized.
- -SB 16 would prohibit a faculty member of an institution of higher education from compelling or attempting to compel "a student enrolled at the institution to adopt a belief that any race, sex or ethnicity, or social or religious belief is inherently superior to any other race, sex, ethnicity or belief."
- -HB 900 Relating to Sexually Explicit Library Materials would require book vendors to adopt and rate books that include "sexually explicit material" and "sexually relevant material", and prohibit book vendors from selling "a book containing sexually explicit material to a school district or open-enrollment charter school."

-HB 1635 would prohibit a party official (for example, a County Chair) from denying a candidate a place on the Ballot who has otherwise complied with the requirements set forth

in the Texas Election Code.


