Veterans Day and Voting: Both are an honor and a right.

Ive thought long and hard about this for the last month and came up with very little. I finally had the brilliant idea of asking Veterans why they served, how long they served, their ranks, their branch of service, and what they thought of those who chose not to vote.

Wow! Was I surprised and embarrassed at the responses I received? I'm not going to use verbatim what they said, as you'd be a little upset at the wording I would need to use! I asked six different men and three women the same question. All the answers were pretty much the same. It was their honor to serve their country and their duty to protect our freedom; it was in their DNA, and even one said he didn't have a choice. I wasn't quite sure what that meant, so I left it alone! I truly can't repeat what they said about those who choose not to vote. However, I can say that all of them agreed that if you don't vote, you don't have a voice, and you shouldn't complain about our country, our laws, or our way of life.

The men and women I'm going to share some of their stories with you are from all over the U.S.A., not just in Texas. They are all veterans and are honored and proud to have served to give us the right to vote and the freedoms we have today.

One of the men served 13 years as a Marine and in the reserves. He enlisted three different times; the first time, he said he joined out of necessity. For the other two enlistments, he said it was his duty. He said he gained a home and family and learned discipline when he enlisted in the Marines. In 1983, he was in Beirut when the suicide bombing took place at the U.S. Embassy, he saw lives lost and destruction, yet he continued to serve. After this tour of duty, he re-enlisted two more times. He served as an operations Sergeant. He stated that at one time, he loved his country no matter how messed up it became.

He said he fought for the rights of the people, and one of those rights is voting.

His last statement to me was, "It was a privilege to serve, and I wouldn't change anything"

One of the men served for 21 years as a 2nd Lieutenant and an Army Captain. He was a member of the Opposing Force, trained US tank and mechanized forces, Light Infantry, airborne and ranger forces, and served with the NATO forces. When I asked him why he enlisted, he said he was a student of history, he always loved the Army and the Republic, and that it was his calling.

Another one said enlisting in the military was never a doubt. He served 20 years and retired as a Major. His father, his brothers, and his uncles were all career soldiers. Serving was in his DNA. He said that while serving his country and fighting for our rights, he saw men/and women die; some were maimed for life, yet it was an honor to serve his country. He would do it all over again.

I asked some of them if they would vote, and they responded with a resounding "YES". They said they fought to keep the right to vote, and even if I don't like the candidates, I will exercise that right. They will be voting RED also.

In talking with them, I know they are proud of their paths and being an American.

I also know that if you are reading this newsletter, you are proud to be an American and that you are going to vote and more than likely have several of your friends and family members vote, too. Remind them to vote RED.

Whether you served in the military, was a member of the PTA, volunteered at a local food pantry, or are a candidate in a state or local office, no matter who you are, you have the right and the privilege to vote, and you should take advantage of that right, and we should remind others to do so also.

We can share our political views with others, even though they may disagree with us and get angry, rude, or even decide not to speak to us.

We can share our views with kindness, and no harsh words need to be spoken.



The Word tells us that we should be quick to listen, slow to speak, and not get angry easily. Share with others love, kindness, and truth. You may not be able to change their minds if they disagree, but you will reap what you sow.

James 1:19-20


