Thirty-three days (as of May 1st) left in the 89th Legislative session to get House and Senate Bills to the finish line. We have included the May/June 2025 Calendar summarizing the end-of-session deadlines.

Legislature Deadlines

The "Legislative Process in Texas" summarizes the many phases of a regular legislative session and provides descriptions of bills/resolutions, committee members' roles/responsibilities, the Conference Committee, the House & Intent Calendar, and other helpful information (please see attached).

The above information can be found on <u>Texas Legislature Online (TLO)</u>. It is easy to navigate and provides the most current information. For example, if you want to know about all the Amendments to House Bill 2 (HB 2), follow these directions:

Go to the TLO Home page; click Amendments under Search Legislation; populate the Bill Number Box with HB 2; and hit Enter. You will find who authored the Amendment and whether it was adopted/failed or tabled.

Reviewing everything TLO offers is excellent; however, I encourage you to visit our Capital to watch our Representatives in action. We had the privilege to witness Public Education Chairman, Brad Buckley, on April 16th defend HB 2. Brad's ability to stay focused on the facts and manage the many personalities that attacked HB 2 was impressive. HB 2 has now moved forward to what is known as a Conference Committee, which happens when there are differences between the House and Senate versions of the bill with approval to be signed by Governor Greg Abbott on Saturday, May 3, 2025.

Let us continue to pray for our Governor, Legislators, and Texas.
